Persistent Identifiers (PIDs) / Identifiants pérennes

"A persistent identifier (PID) is a globally unique digital string of characters that is associated with a single thing, or entity." – MoreBrains Cooperative, 2022

- String of characters / Chaîne de caractères
- Digital / Numérique
- Persistence is not *inherent* PIDs must be supported through PID registration agencies (e.g., ORCID) – and through <u>your</u> support!




ORCID's Member Portal

- 1. <u>Live Member Reports</u>. Member Report (overall information about your membership), Integration Report (information about your integrations), and Affiliation Report (about scholars at your organization).
- 2. <u>The Affiliation Manager</u> to assert affiliations on behalf of scholars and staff, with their permission, to help you "identify your researchers and track the impact of your institutions' research." Also to formally grant enhanced trustworthiness and legitimacy to the information in an ORCID Record



Affiliation Manager

- This tool allows trusted organizations to add affiliation data to ORCID records.
- Record items added by a verified organizations get a verified checkmark next to them.


Boston University (BU)

- BU Implemented ORCID to make research networking and all aspects of the scholarly enterprise more efficient and effective.
- They found success in:
 - Creating an on-boarding process to identify new faculty for ORCID creation.
 - Targeting anyone on the cusp of graduating.
 - Integrating ORCID with existing researcher networking software.
 - Facilitate the central storage of ORCID IDs for members of the BU community.
- Have served as a resource for other organizations.




Focus Groups - Lessons learned

- The benefits that graduates students value the most.
- ORCID acting like an online CV.
- What they would like to see:
 - Posters and media content about ORCID.
 - Examples of use cases for graduate students early in their academic career.
 - How ORCID compares to similar platforms.



Next Steps - Test group

- Using findings from the focus groups, we have created a communications and outreach plan.
- Testing our plan on one faculty to start.
 - 20-40 participants.
- Our goal is to test out our:
 - Landing page.
 - Outreach strategy.
 - Data collection plan.
- This test group will help us establish data workflows and graduate student and post-doctoral researcher workflows.

Why a national strategy?

- Community-driven approach
- Collaborative work across sectors
- National funding to support centralized initiatives
- National policies (Open Science)

- Identify priority PIDs (Report)
- Outputs: PID Matrix, Gap Analysis
